This workshop offers the opportunity for case managers and therapists to enhance their knowledge and skills in the engagement and management of clients with complex needs. Discussed clients are those who: have co-morbid health and mental health disorders, are reluctant to engage, pose risks to themselves or others, have multi-service involvement, and have been mandated for treatment by civil or criminal justice orders. We will explore contemporary evidence-based practices with the links between mental illness and offending, balancing risk mitigation, client recovery and client-centred risk management. The ethical dilemmas and challenges of client confidentiality, particularly when communicating risks with other services, will also be discussed. This will be an interactive session using case studies, with opportunities to reflect upon practice.
