- family and social supports
- how you are feeling
- lifestyle and cultural beliefs

Respect:

We expect you will treat our staff, carers, visitors and other consumers with respect and dignity.

Safety:

We expect that you will treat our facilities with care and keep them clean and safe. We expect you to follow guidelines and directions. Please do not behave aggressively or in an unsafe way.

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STATEMENT OF RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

for Consumers at Forensicare





Forensicare is committed to providing consumers with information and resources to support their rights and responsibilities as well as their recovery and wellbeing.

This statement of consumer rights and responsibilities helps Forensicare and consumers work in partnership to bring about the best possible healthcare outcomes. The statement is based on the *Australian Charter of Healthcare Rights* and consumer rights under the *Mental Health Act 2014*, specifically for consumers of Forensicare's services.

Forensicare provides services in accordance with the mental health principles under the *Mental Health Act 2014* and where possible, provides mental health services in the least restrictive way possible.

Mental Health Act 2014

The *Mental Health Act 2014* requires all mental health services to work within principles that include respect for people's dignity, promotion of supported decision making and treatment in the least restrictive environment.

Australian Charter of Healthcare Rights

Human rights are the basic rights that belong to all of us. They are the foundation for freedom, justice, peace and respect for all people. The Australian Charter of Healthcare Rights describes the rights of patients and consumers using the Australian health care system. It places emphasise on freedom, equality and dignity. These rights are essential in making sure the healthcare provided to you by Forensicare is of a high quality and is safe.

Who is a 'Consumer'?

The term 'Consumer' refers to people who are currently receiving mental health treatment or support at any of Forensicare's services.

What you can expect from us

Participation I have a right to be included in decisions and choices about my care.	Forensicare will involve you in decisions about your assessment, treatment and recovery.
Privacy I have a right to privacy and confidentiality of my personal information.
